Report of the Boats Lost in the Month of September

"Let us at this time, with a moment of silent prayer, remember our Shipmates who made the supreme sacrifice that we may gather here in Peace."

- <u>USS POMPANO (SS181)</u> Pompano was lost in either late August or early September 1943. 78 souls lost. She most likely hit a Japanese mine. Possibly lost to a combined attack from Japanese air and surface units off the northeastern Honshu, Japan
- <u>USS GRAYLING (SS209)</u> Lost on September 9, 1943. 76 Souls lost. Likely rammed and sank by Japanese transport Hokuan Maru, South China Sea west of Luzon.
- <u>USS CISCO (SS290)</u> Lost to a Japanese observation seaplane (945th Kokutai) and to gunboat Karatsu (**FORMALLY USS LUZON (PR7)**) in Sulu Sea off Panay Island. 76 Killed.
- <u>S-51 (SS162)</u> Lost after collision with steamer City of Rome off Block Island, Rhode Island 25SEP25. 33 Lost.
- <u>S-5 (SS110)</u> Lost 01SEP20. No souls lost. She sank on a practice dive off Delaware by the skull. Her crew was rescued from her stern in the next few days.
